My patrol!


When you and your friends are at scouts you will spend time in a small group called a patrol. Your patrol has a PL, who helps organise and leads your patrol.

Your scout meetings are run by a great team of scout leaders. Do you know their scouting name. Maybe your troop doesn't use scout names if not do yo know their names.








Your uniform

During you time in the scouts you will collect and earn lots of badges to go on your uniform. Can you match the badges on the shirt with the list of badges?




There's lots of exciting badges to complete as a Scout. Can you name the ones pictured below?

The scout promise is a simple way to help everyone in your troop keep the purpose of scouting in mind. When we make our promise we are making a commitment to promise to live by scouting's code.

The core scout promise is:


On my honour I promise that I will do my best to do my duty to God and to The Queen to help other people and to keep the Scout Law.


