The Beaver Scout Promise

The beaver scout promise

The beaver scout promise is a simple way to help your youngster to keep the purpose of scouting in mind. When They make their promise they are making a commitment to promise to live by the things we think are important in scouting, we call these our values.

Our values can sometimes be difficult for young people to understand so, Beavers, Cubs, Scouts, Explorers, Scout Network Members and leaders all make a 'Promise' and follow a 'Law'.

The core Beaver Scout Promise is:

This activity challenges beavers to think about their promise and complete our promise puzzle to build your very own promise torch. Whilst completing the challenge take time to talk to your child about what their promise means to them and what they promised to do when they made their promise.

Talk to them about the fact that the Beaver Scout Promise isn't just for during meetings or when they are wearing their uniform, it's there for every day of the week and everything they do. Ask them to think about times when they have done the things in their promise — can they think of a time where it was difficult to do their best, but they tried anyway? What about a time when they were kind and helpful? What about when they showed their love, whether it was for God, their world, their Dharma, or Allah? It's not always easy to do these things, what's important is that all beaver scouts try their best.

The beaver scout promise explained

When we promise something, we are telling people that we really mean what we say. So what does the Beaver Scout Promise mean?

"I promise to do my best"

You promise to do your best at everything you do, for example:


- at school

- at home doing your homework
- doing sporting activities
- playing a musical instrument
- doing your hobbies
- and of course, at your beaver meetings.

"To be kind and helpful"

Do what you can to help other people who need your help. Do not wait to be asked for help. Share the good things you have. Be friendly towards other people.

"And to love God." To care for the world around you. To pray to your God in the way you have learnt.

Can you complete our promise torch puzzle?


We are not going to tell you how to make your promise torch, that's for you to figure out yourself!


We will tell you that it has:


- a torch cone (the bit you hold)

- 4 marshmallow on sticks!





