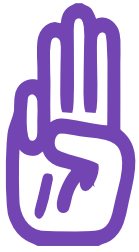

The cub scout promise is a simple way to help you to keep the purpose of scouting in mind. When we make our promise we are making a commitment to promise to live by the things we think are important in scouting, we call these our values.

Our values of scouting can sometimes be difficult for young people to understand so, Beavers, Cubs, Scouts, Explorers, Scout Network Members and leaders all make a 'Promise' and follow a 'Law'.

The core Cub Scout Promise is:

I promise that I will do my best
to do my duty to God and to The Queen
to help other people
and to keep the Cub Scout Law.

This activity challenges you to think about your promise and complete our promise puzzle to build your very own promise torch. Whilst completing the challenge take time to think about what your promise means to you and what you promised to do when you made your promise.

The Cub Scout Promise isn't just for during meetings or when you are wearing your uniform, it's there for every day of the week and everything we do. Think about times when you've done the things in your promise — can you think of a time where it was difficult to do your best, but you tried anyway? What about a time when you were kind and helpful? What about when you showed your love, whether it was for God, your world, your Dharma, or Allah? It's not always easy to do these things, what's important is that we try our best.

The Cub Scout Promise explained

"I promise that I will do my best"

You will always try and do as well as you can, because it is very important to you. You will not always succeed with what you are doing. But, you will always know that you have given your best attempt!

"to do my duty to God and to the Queen"

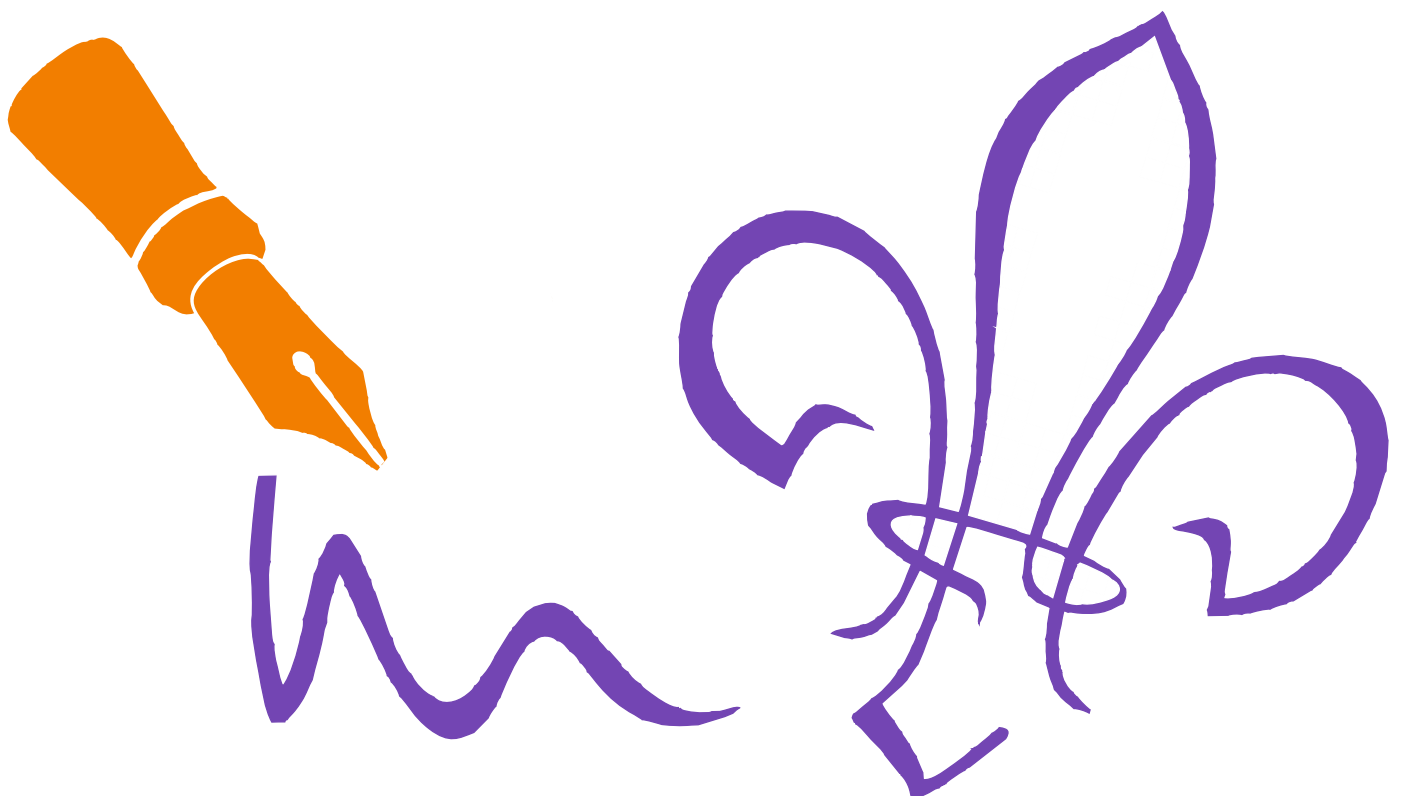
Duties are tasks which you have to do. You should try to do those things you know need doing before someone else asks you to do them. Your duty to the Queen, includes showing respect for her and what she stands for as the head of your country. This includes obeying the laws of your country (and any other country which you visit). Your duty to God means being mindful and respectful of the world around you and doing everything you can to help the environment.

"to help other people"

Whenever you see someone in need of help, don't let them struggle, find out if there is anything you can do to help them.

"and to keep the Cub Scout Law"

You will always do your utmost to obey the 'rules' of the Cub Scout.

- 4 marshmallow on sticks!

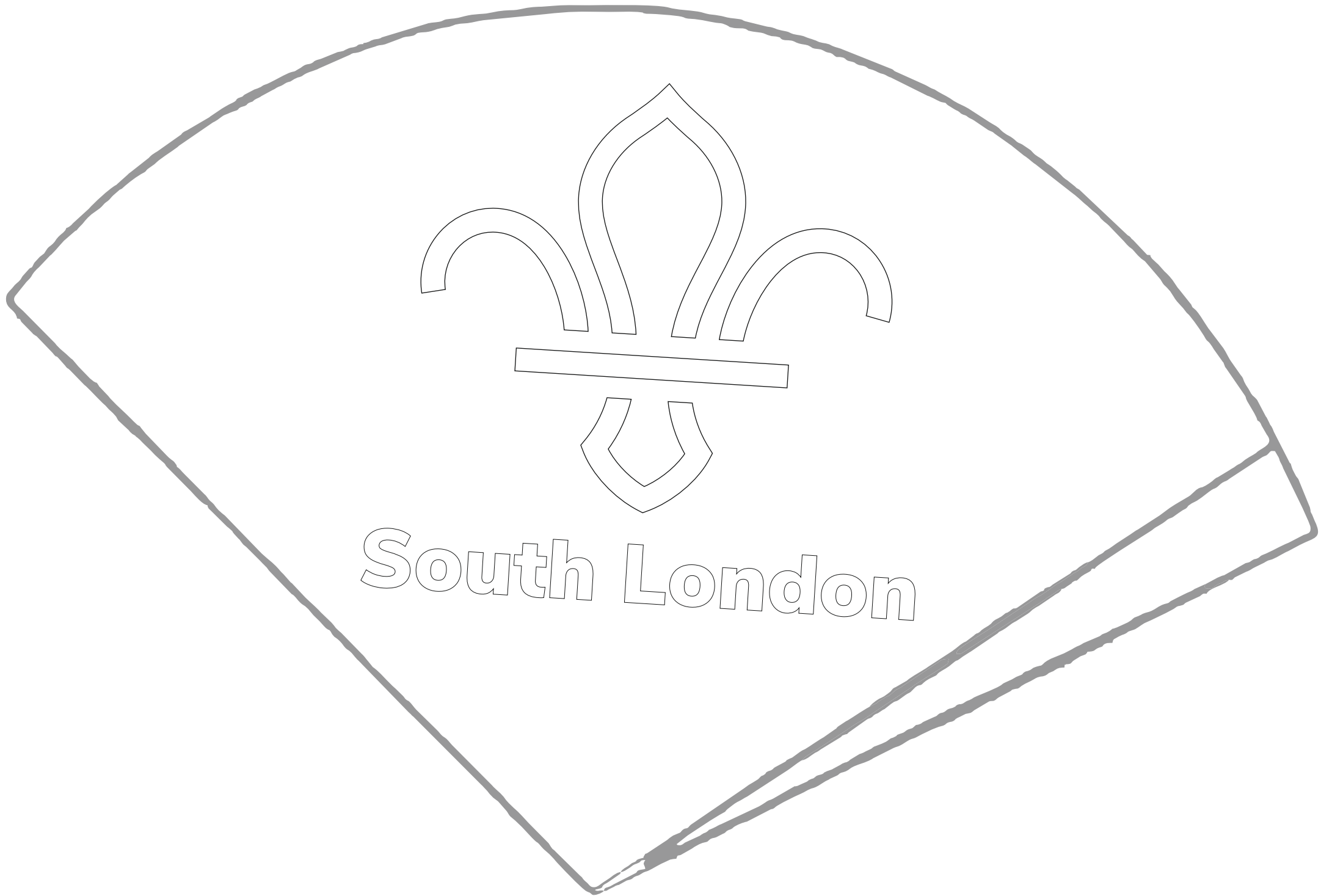


Bonus points - for including the motto rainbow!

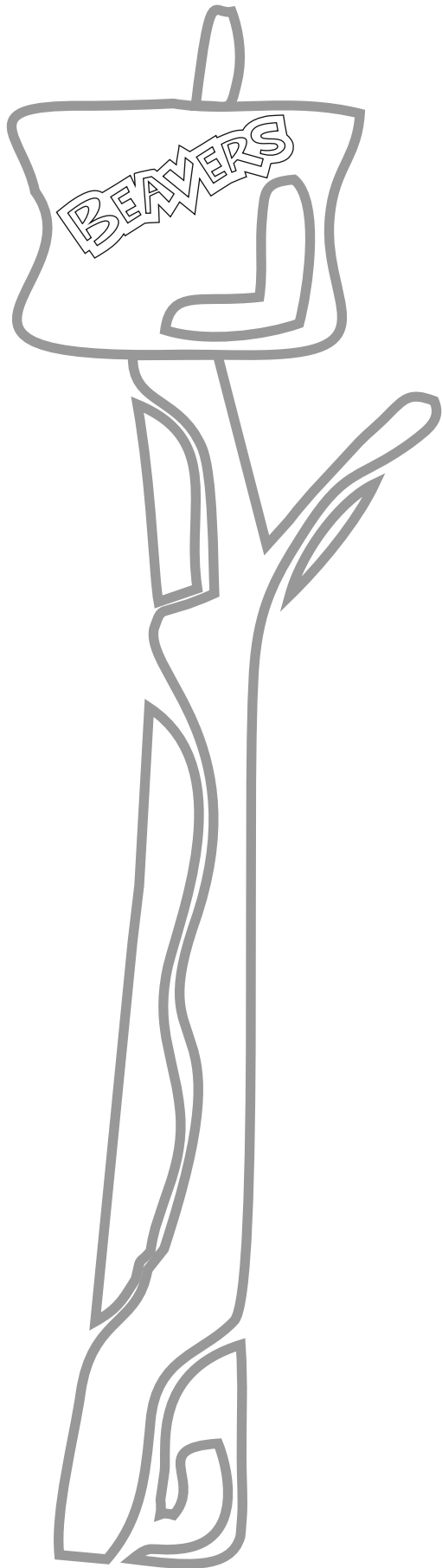
As you complete our promise torch puzzle think about what it represents and stands for. As you stick each flame onto the torch, discuss the part of the promise it stands for.

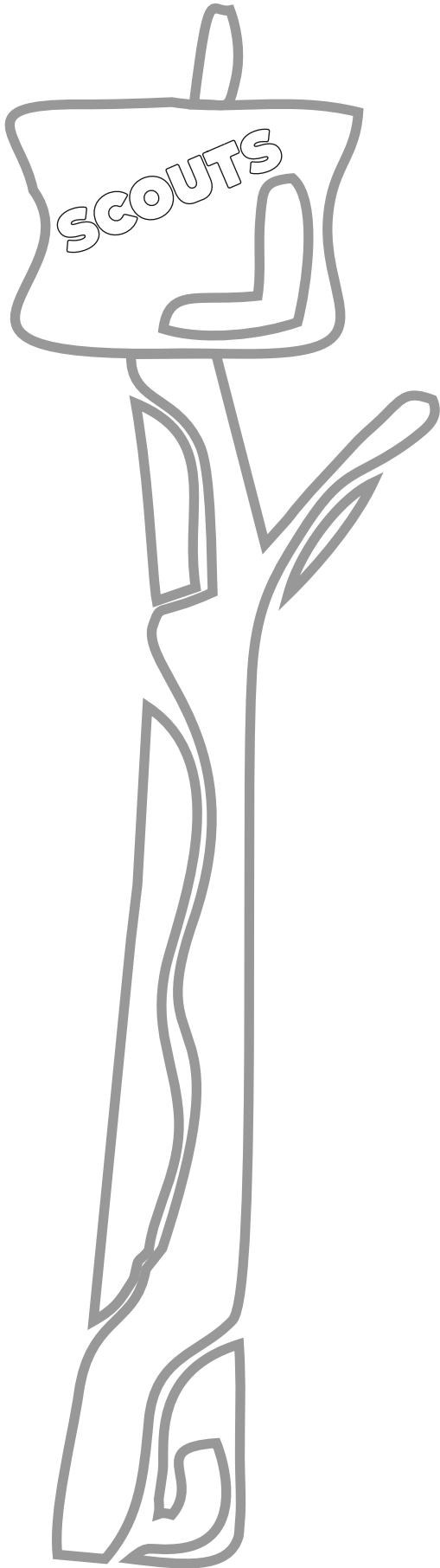
Also think about what a promise is and what it means to make one, why a promise is important.

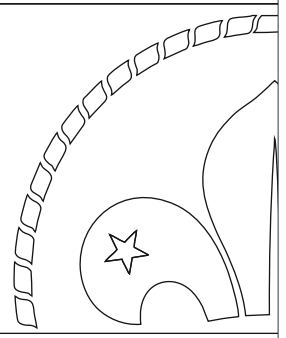
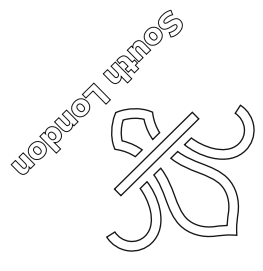
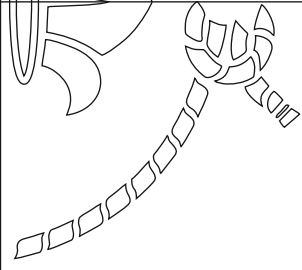


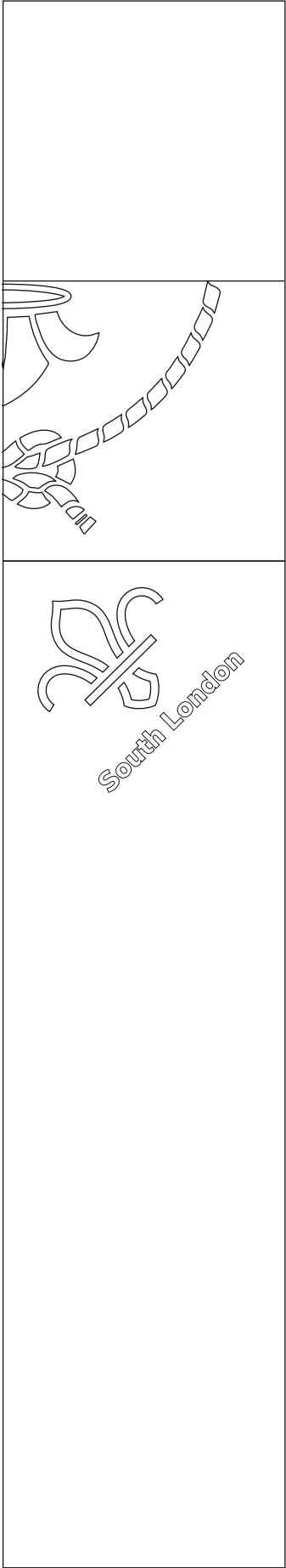
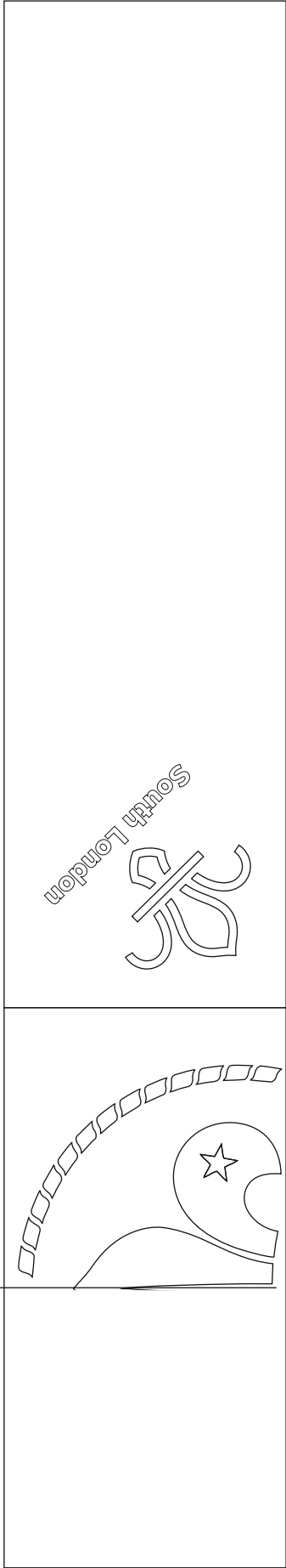
